

Take Action on Invasive Species!

Inviting youth to join us for a day of discussion and hands on learning and find out how you can protect your territories from the spread of invasive species!

When: August 3rd 2019, 10 AM - 2 PM

Where: Tynehead Park, Surrey BC

In partnership with Catching the Spirit, the Invasive Species Council of BC would like to invite all youth between the ages of 15-30 to a FREE hands-on day of invasive species education, removal, discussion and activities. Indigenous youth are especially welcome - at this event we will be discussing how invasive species impact our lands, waters, territories and way of life.

- **»** Participants will develop some hands-on identification, removal and prevention skills, and tackle some invasive species hands-on!
- » Lunch and refreshments will be provided to participants!
- » Funds for transportation are available.
- » Participants will receive a letter of acknowledgment that can be used for resume building.
- This event will be documented by a film crew and participants will have the opportunity to include your reflections about the day in the film.

About the Film:

This event will be filmed, and participants will have the opportunity to share their thoughts on invasive species, environmental issues, and youth engagement.

In this film, Indigenous youth will be actively demonstrating how they work to protect their territories and connect to the land through engaging in environmental stewardship activities that focus primarily on invasive species management. This film will highlight how youth, through taking action to protect their territories and communities, foster a greater understanding of their natural environment, connections to traditional practices and a greater sense of community on their traditional territories.
