

Notice of Nomination Meeting

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the electors of the Sumas First Nation will be held in the Sumas First Nation Health Building Board Room, located at 2788 Sumas Mountain Road, Abbotsford, B.C. on the 11th day of March, 2022, beginning at 6:00 o'clock P.M. and lasting for at least two hours, for the purpose of nominating a Chief and candidates for positions on the Band Council of the said Band for the next ensuing term. Three (3) Councillor Positions and <u>one(1)</u> position for Chief are available. The election will be held at The Sumas First Nation Health Building Board Room at 2788 Sumas Mountain Road, Abbotsford, B.C., on April 29, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Please note that any Elector may nominate candidates by using a mail-in nomination form. Electors residing off-reserve may nominate or run as a candidate for the position of Chief and Council. You can either deliver, mail or Email written nomination forms and completed, signed and witnessed voter declaration forms to the electoral officer before the time set for the nomination meeting OR you may nominate candidates orally at the nomination meeting. Mailed nominations not received by the electoral officer before the time set for the nomination meeting are void. Also note that any voter may vote in person or by mail-in ballot.

PLEASE NOTE: NOMINATED CANDIDATES MUST BE PRESENT AT THE NOMINATION MEETING TO ACCEPT THEIR NOMINATION.

All Sumas First Nation Members, 18 years or older, are eligible to vote in the election. Given under my hand at Delta, B.C. this 6h day of February, 2022.

The personalized kits can be a real comfort for your children in case of fire, earthquake, floods etc. Below is just a guideline to follow when compiling a comfort kit but feel free to add the snacks, etc. you prefer for your child.

Emergency Comfort Kits

Dear Parents,

In case of an emergency (earthquake etc.), we have an emergency plan in place. Part of this emergency plan is that each child is required to have a comfort kit stored at our facility.

Please fill the attached Ziploc bag with the following items:

- A family photo
- A letter of comfort/reassurance
- A small toy (toy car, small stuffed animal etc.)
- Three non-perishable granola bars
- Three non-perishable snack items (fruit to go's, applesauce, raisins, and fruit snacks)
- Small package of candy

Please label the Ziploc bag with your child's name and return it to Busy Bear Club Preschool as soon as possible.

These comfort kits will be stored at our facility and returned at the end of the year in June.



Approval of 12 Rental Homes on Sumas First Nation

It gives us immense pleasure to let you all know that CHMC has approved Sumas First Nation's application for Rapid Housing Initiative with approved funding of \$2.3 million. This funding is to be used over the next 6 months to construct 15 rental homes on Lot 19 Kilgard Road West.

The project is a big boost to our rental housing and when complete would add 6 one bed and 6 two bed fully furnished rental suites. The houses built will be fully accessible, high energy homes, complete with furniture – ready to move in.

Construction started in February 2022 and the project is expected to be completed by July 2022.



Rental Homes

Sumas First Nation is pleased to announce that we have been approved for 15 rental units which are presently under construction on Kilgard Road and Lakeview Drive. The units comprise of 8 two-bedroom and 7 one-bedroom units. These 15 units are part of CHMC's Rapid Housing and City of Abbotsford's Reaching Home Initiative. These units are in addition to the 6 duplex units which are near completion on Lakeview Drive.

CMHC Rapid Housing Project

The Rapid Housing project to construct 12 units on Kilgard Road started in mid January 2022 and is expected to be completed by mid Aug 2022. These units are in three buildings and when completed will be fully furnished units.

Reaching Homes Project

Sumas First Nation also started work on the 3 rental units approved as part of Reaching Home Initiative sponsored by the City of Abbotsford. Of the 3 units approved two are modular homes on Lakeview Drive and one unit is part of the project on Kilgard Road. The two units on Lakeview Drive are expected to be completed by May 2022.

CMHC Section 95 Project

CMHC approved the 6 rental units as part of three duplexes on Lakeview Drive. They are now close to completion and have been allocated to housing applicants from the Housing List.

Housing Applications

You may submit in your housing rental application to be added to the Housing List or resubmit to keep our file up to date. With the application you are required to read the Sema:th Rental Housing Policies & Procedures document and initial every page. The tenant selection Point System is in the policy, please review the procedure.

Housing Governance Project

Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) approved the Housing Governance Project. This will include the housing policy update, the housing plan development and the Housing and Lot Needs Assessment update.


Equipment Storage

During the recent floods, a need was felt to procure a number of equipment's which would help the Nation during such emergencies.

Sumas First Nation received \$80,000 as funding from Vancouver Foundation and other sources. It is proposed that a joint compound be constructed for equipment's and machinery's being procured by SFN and LFFA.

The proposed compound will be temporary chain-link structure with a metal shed to park equipment's such as forklift, boats and other emergency equipment. Location of the compound is the open land across our administrative office building. A sketch showing the layout and location is attached below.

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Sumas First Nation

Please be advised that Sumas First Nation is beginning work on the Inflow & Infiltration Sewer Repairs project. The repair works will take place over the year.

Inflow & infiltration (I&I) occurs when water from the environment (such as rainwater) enters the sanitary sewer system. The increased flow from I&I puts excess strain on the sewer system, preventing future development. In addition, increased flow can also result in sewer backups that may impacting the community and surrounding environment.

As it stands, the community's sewer system experiences significant I&I due to aging infrastructure. This project aims to repair identified issues in the system that are causing increased loading. By solving this issue, the community and environment will be protected from potential contamination, and future expansion of the community will become possible.

Construction is expected to begin in **early May, and will last for 3 months.** The contractor will be required to provide 3 weeks notice for any works within Certificate of Possession lots. A construction crew and moving equipment will be on site. Most of the works will occur in roadways or outside of residential lots, however multiple homes will be briefly affected. Excavation, trench backfilling, temporary sewer bypassing, and surface reinstatement works will occur. Any disturbance or damages caused by the contractor will be repaired to previous condition or better.

We appreciate your patience during construction. Please drive slowly and keep a safe distance from construction equipment.


