

Reminder to Community – PREVENTION OF DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND NUISANCE LAW

On May 25th, 2015, Chief & Council issued a Council Resolution to approve of the *Prevention of Disorderly Conduct and Nuisance Law*. This law was established to prevent disorderly behavior and both public and private nuisances. This law defines nuisances as activities such as, but not limited to:

- The abandonment of cars, household appliances or furniture.
- The dumping of storage, tires, garbage, and other refuse.
- The burning of tires, grass, garbage, leaves, and other refuse.
- The discharge of any potentially noxious substance into air or water.

Over the past several months, we have recorded and/or received complaints about several violations of this law including:

- Littering in and around Kilgard Creek.
- Uncontrolled mass burning of woody debris and vegetation.
- Burning of garbage.
- Abandonment of household goods and waste on CP land.

This is a reminder that the *Prevention of Disorderly Conduct and Nuisance Law* applies to all of Sumas First Nation lands, including CP land. Sumas First Nation implements fire bans as they are issued by British Columbia's regional fire centres and will only permit fires outside of fire bans. Even then, fires created by community members are to be reasonably small and controlled and created for either cultural or entertainment purposes. Under no circumstances should fires be created for the purposes of waste removal. All vegetative and solid waste must be removed from Sumas First Nation lands and sent to an approved facility.

Sumas First Nation reserves the right to issue warning letters and fines (at a maximum of \$1000) to violators of the *Prevention of Disorderly Conduct and Nuisance Law*.
